# TANNER TRAILHEAD

## Welcome to Tanner Trail

The Tanner Trail is steep, requires some route finding, and is heavily maintained, with many boundaries to forage in the riparian zone (2 kilometers). The Tanner Trail is approximately 10 kilometers (6.2 miles) to Tanner Beach and permits are required for overnight camping. Please visit the Backcountry Information Center for overnight camping and permitting information. It is not recommended to hike to the river and back to see the Aqueduct and rescue efforts are often delayed to this area.
